Up to 5,000 SF built to suit restaurant space for lease in Riverbridge Mixed Use Village. Riverbridge is a mixed-use, architecturally enhanced village under construction in Berlin, Massachusetts, adjacent to Solomon Pond Mall and Solomon Pond Park. Located off of Donald Lynch Boulevard, which features a 1.6 million SF Class A office/R&D space and 1.1 million SF of retail shops. Berlin features direct access to major interstate highways, close proximity to regional rail services and international airports.

Riverbridge Highlights
